Clown Girl lives in Baloneytown, a seedy neighborhood where drugs, balloon animals, and even rubber chickens contribute to the local currency. Against a backdrop of petty crime, she struggles to live her dreams, calling on cultural masters Charlie Chaplin, Kafka, and da Vinci for inspiration. In an effort to support herself and her layabout performance-artist boyfriend, Clown Girl finds herself unwittingly transformed into a "corporate clown," trapping herself in a cycle of meaningless, high-paid gigs that veer dangerously close to prostitution. Monica Drake has created a novel that riffs on the high comedy of early film stars — most notably Chaplin and W. C. Fields — to raise questions of class, gender, economics, and prejudice. Resisting easy classification, this debut novel blends the bizarre, the humorous, and the gritty with stunning skill.

Four Portland friends navigate the complexities of motherhood and friendship against the backdrop of the city.

From the Downtown streets littered with strip clubs and gutter punks to the north side where gentrification and old school hip-hop collide, Portland, Oregon is a place that seems straight out of a David Lynch movie. It's a city full of police controversies, hippie artist houses and overzealous liberals, where even its fiction blurs with its bizarre realities.

*Sacred and Immoral: On the Writings of Chuck Palahniuk*, edited by Jeffrey A. Sartain, combines the efforts of an international list of writers to explore the depths of Chuck Palahniuk's fiction. Scholars have paid attention Palahniuk's premiere novel, *Fight Club*, for years. *Sacred and Immoral* is the first anthology dedicated to scholarship focused on Palahniuk's work following *Fight Club*, which he has been producing at an average of a book a year for thirteen years. By collecting the work of an interdisciplinary group of scholars under a single cover, *Sacred and Immoral* extends the reach of Palahniuk scholarship beyond any previous publication. *Sacred and Immoral* provides the single most comprehensive and useful scholarly resource to date for anyone wishing to examine Chuck Palahniuk's fiction in an academic context. Some of the anthology's chapters situate Palahniuk's work within existing generic conventions, while other chapters are concerned with the theoretical underpinnings of Palahniuk's writing and the philosophical implications of his work. With eleven new critical analyses of

Palahniuk's later novels, *Sacred and Immoral* drastically expands the range and depth of academic inquiry into Palahniuk's fiction commensurate with the prominent and exciting position Palahniuk's work occupies in contemporary culture. *Sacred and Immoral* also includes a new interview with Chuck Palahniuk, conducted by literary scholar Matt Kavanagh. Finally, *Sacred and Immoral* boasts the most complete primary and secondary bibliographies of Palahniuk-related materials to date. *Sacred and Immoral* is not an attempt to have the last word on Chuck Palahniuk's literature. Rather, this volume is a springboard for other projects that relate to Palahniuk's writings. The anthology provides a critical framework for Palahniuk's later literature that students, teachers, and researchers can use in their own classrooms and writing.

When Phil Jourdan's mother died suddenly in 2009, she left behind a legacy of kindness and charity — but she also left unanswered some troubling questions. Was she, as she once claimed, a spy? Had she suffered more profoundly as a woman and parent than she'd let on? Jourdan's recollections of his struggles with psychosis, and his reconstructions of conversations with his enigmatic mother, form the core of this memoir. Psychoanalysis, poetry and confession all merge to tell the story of an ordinary woman whose death turned her into a symbol for extraordinary motherhood.

Sarah studies animal behavior at the Oregon Zoo. An expert on the mating habits of captive animals, she is increasingly desperate to create sweet little offspring of her own. Georgie is busy navigating the terrors of new motherhood—from misplaced postpartum painkillers to the potential sublimation of her identity—while her husband finds solace in bourbon and televised violence. (Dead girl on the screen? Take a shot!). Dulcet, defiantly married and childless, makes a living stripping down in high school gyms to sell the beauty of sex-ed. Nyla is out to save the earth while possibly losing her own teen daughter to the world of drugs and the occult. As these friends navigate a space between freedom and intimacy, they realize the families they forge through shared experience are as important as those inherited through birth. A smart, edgy, and poignantly funny exploration of the complexities of what parenthood means today, *The Stud Book* demonstrates that when it comes to babies, we can learn a lot by considering our place in the animal kingdom.

*Dora: A Headcase* is a contemporary coming-of-age story based on Freud's famous case study—retold and revamped through Dora's point of view, with shotgun blasts of dark humor and sexual play. Ida needs a shrink . . . or so her philandering father thinks, and he sends her to a Seattle psychiatrist. Immediately wise to the head games of her new shrink, whom she nicknames Siggy, Ida begins a coming-of-age journey. At the beginning of her therapy, Ida, whose alter ego is Dora, and her small posse of pals engage in "art attacks." Ida's in love with her friend Obsidian, but when she gets close to intimacy, she faints or loses her voice. Ida and her friends hatch a plan to secretly film Siggy and make an experimental art film. But something goes wrong at a crucial moment—at a nearby hospital Ida finds her father suffering a heart attack. While Ida loses her voice, a rough cut of her experimental film has gone viral, and unethical media agents are hunting her down. A chase ensues in which everyone wants what Ida has.

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
